



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS – GENERAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

TRAVEL ADVISORY NOTE

In our increasingly connected and complex world, the risks of international travel are unavoidable. UCT encourages safe, culturally respectful global travel by UCT students and staff and endeavours to provide all of the necessary information to make those travels as successful as possible.

The University has not established explicit travel policies in regard to students who go on Exchange but instead recommends that awardees review travel alerts, warnings and other relative information on consulate websites or those provided by the International Academic Programmes Office (IAPO), so as to help inform members of the UCT community while traveling. IAPO will therefore provide assistance to the student with repatriation processes should the country they are studying in, face unrest of such a nature that affects the student's learning and living conditions.

Students participating in the University of Cape Town General Exchanges Programme must be aware that they are responsible for exercising good judgment and taking certain precautions to minimize risks to themselves and others during their participation in the programme. This includes engaging in personal risk management when traveling to and from, as well as during the exchanges programme.
